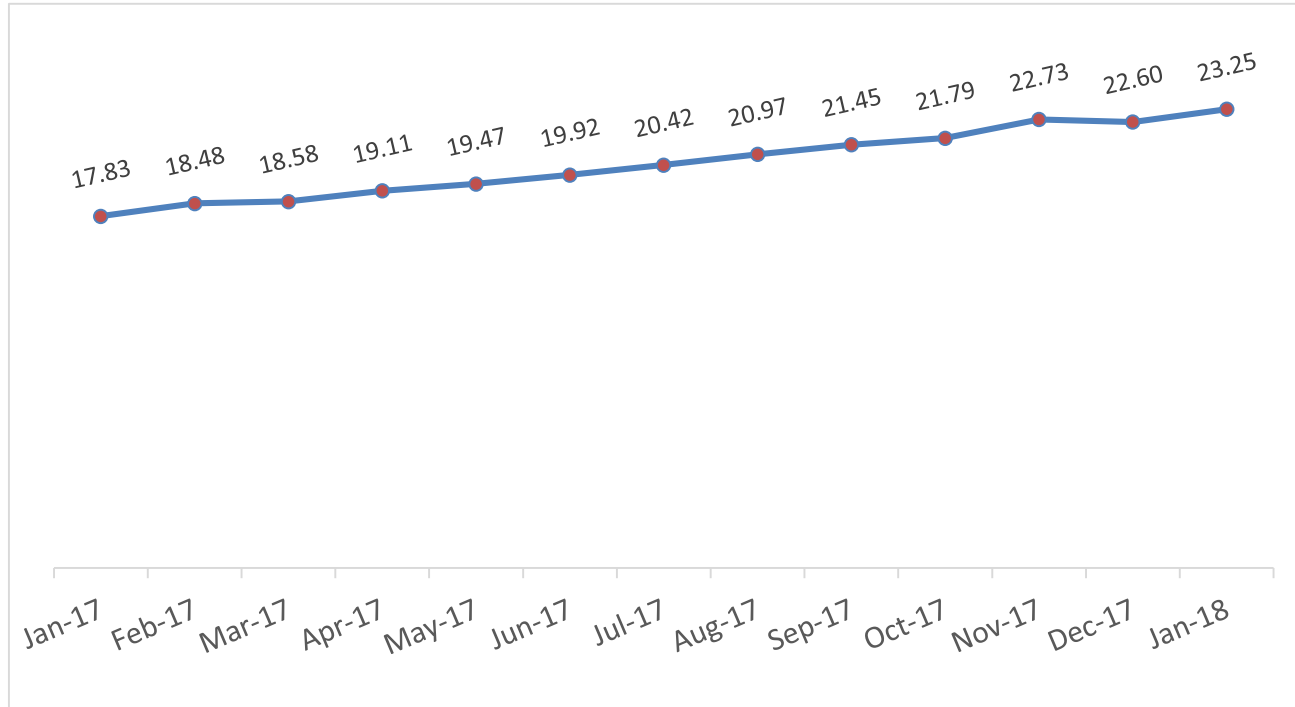


Total Assets (Rs. Trillion)



Assets managed by the Indian mutual fund industry have grown from Rs. 17.83 trillion in January 2017 to Rs. 23.25 trillion in January 2018. That represents a 30.42% growth in assets over January 2017.

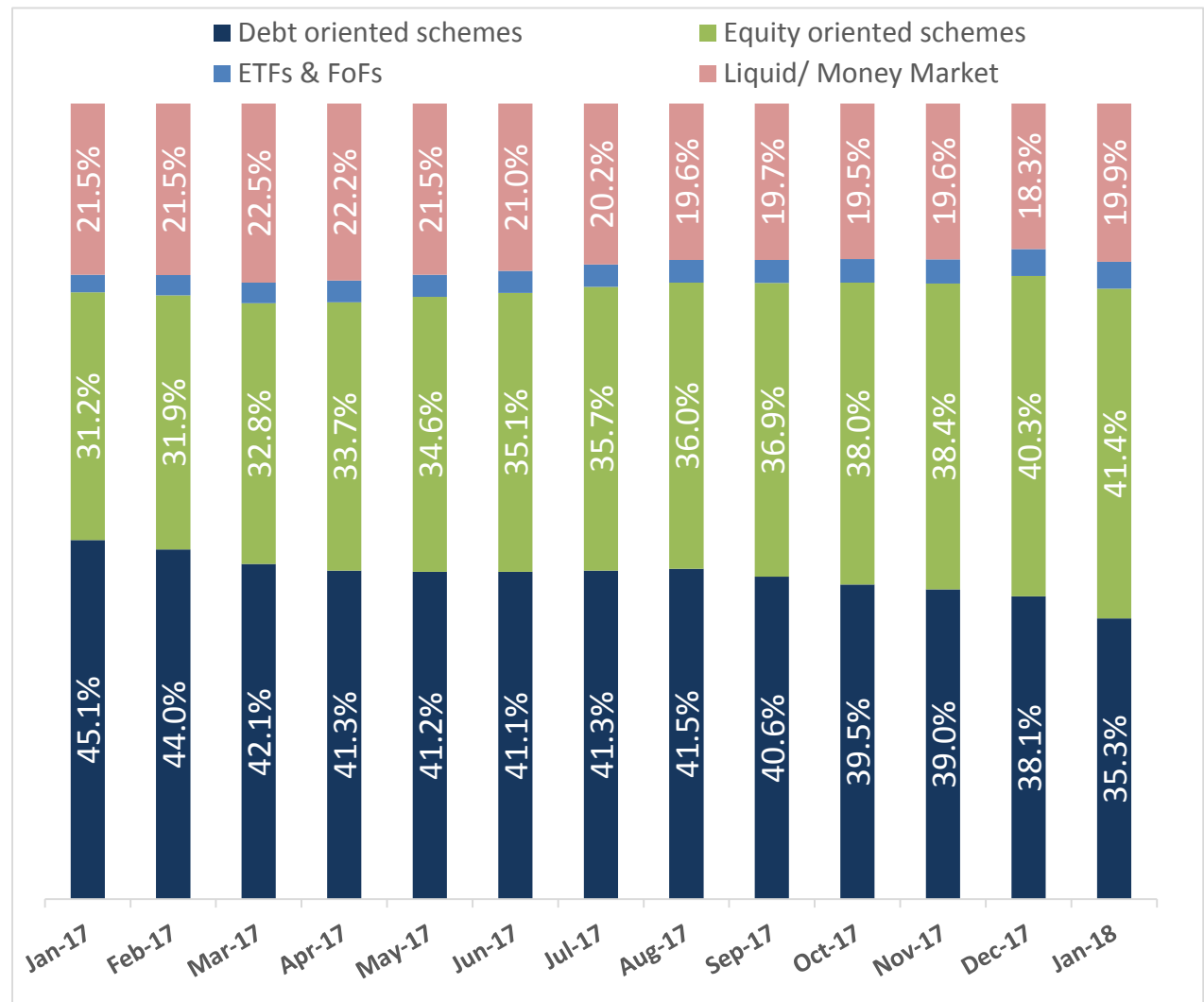
*Assets are measured as average assets for the month.

Scheme wise Composition of Assets

The proportionate share of equity-oriented schemes is now 41.4% of the industry's assets in January 2018, up from 31.2% in January 2017.

The proportionate share of debt-oriented schemes is 35.3% of industry assets in January 2018, down from 45.1% in January 2017.



Equity-oriented schemes include equity and balance funds.

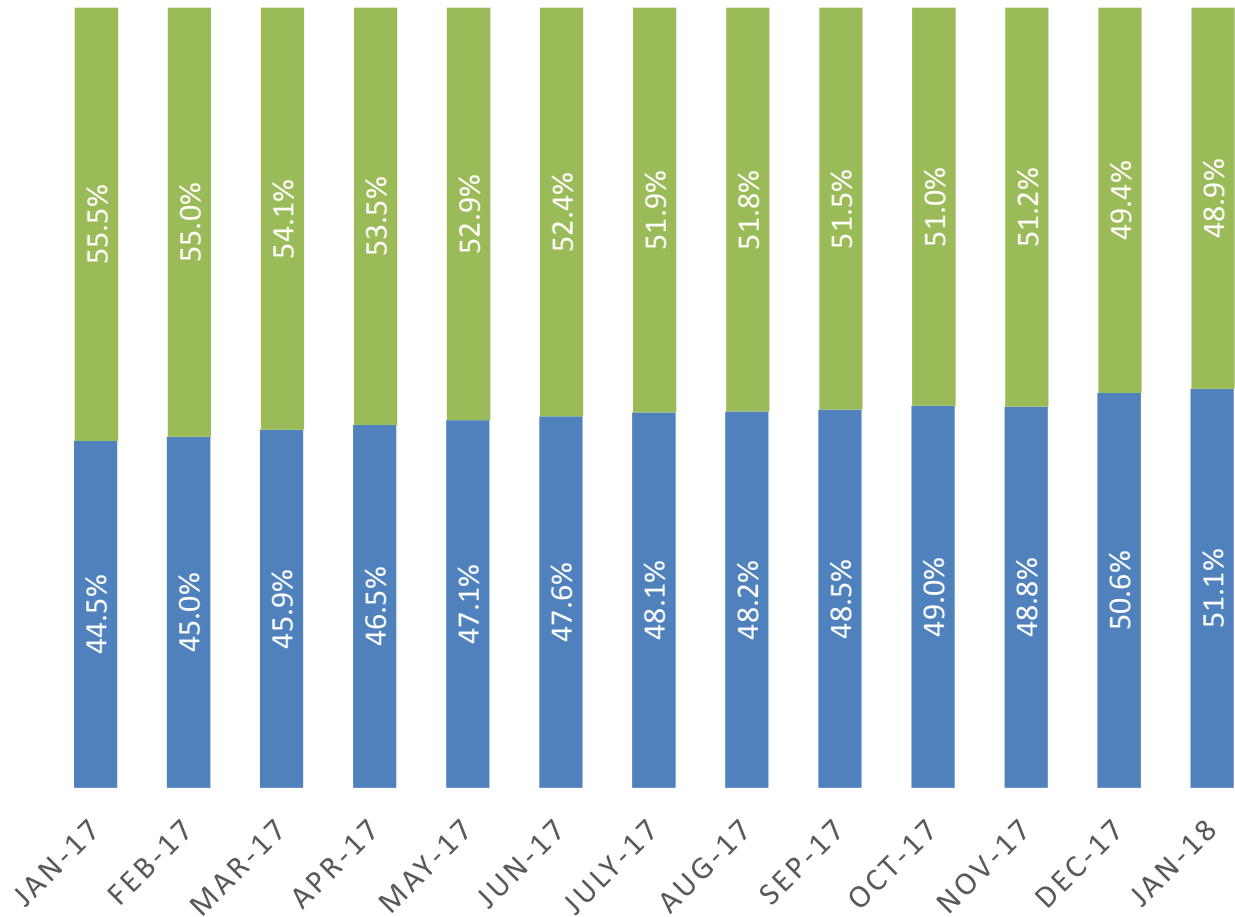
Investor Type-wise Composition of Mutual Fund Assets



■ Individuals ■ Institutions

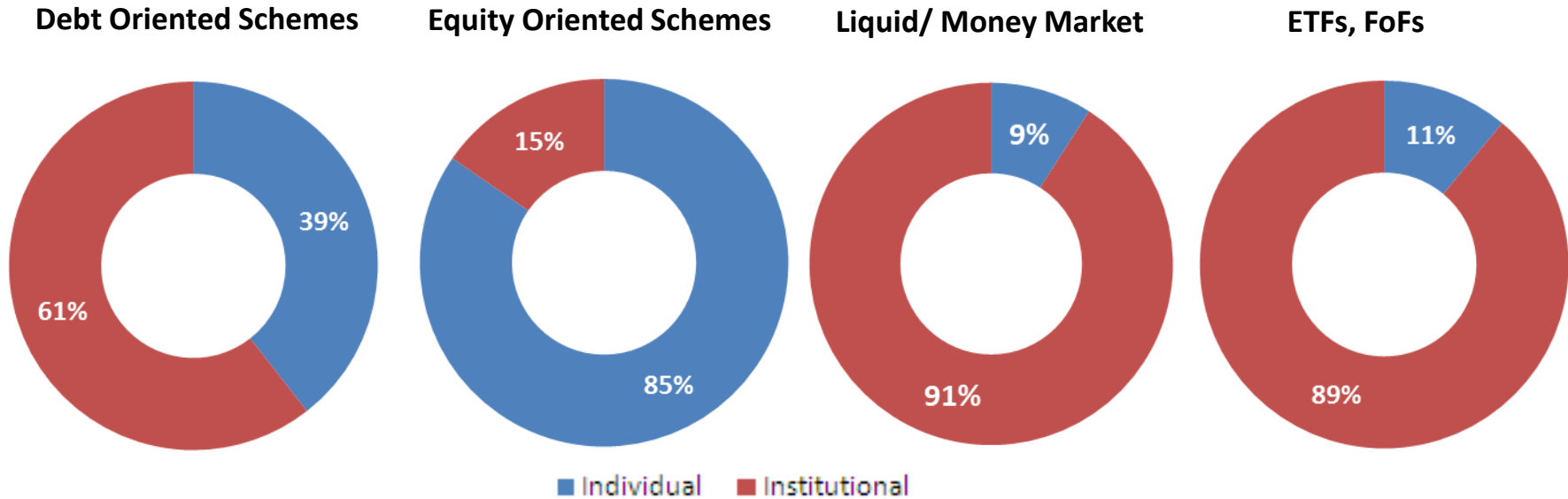
Individual investors now hold a higher share of industry's assets, i.e. 51.1% in January 2018, compared with 44.5% in January 2017.

Institutional investors account for 48.9% of the assets, of which corporates are 90%. The rest are Indian and foreign institutions and banks.



Institutions include domestic and foreign institutions and banks. HNIs are investors who invest with a ticket size of Rs.5 lakhs or above.

Investor Categories Across Scheme Types



Equity-oriented schemes derive 85% of their assets from individual investors (Retail + HNI)

Institutional investors dominate liquid and money market schemes (91%), debt oriented schemes (61%) and ETF's, FOFs (89%).

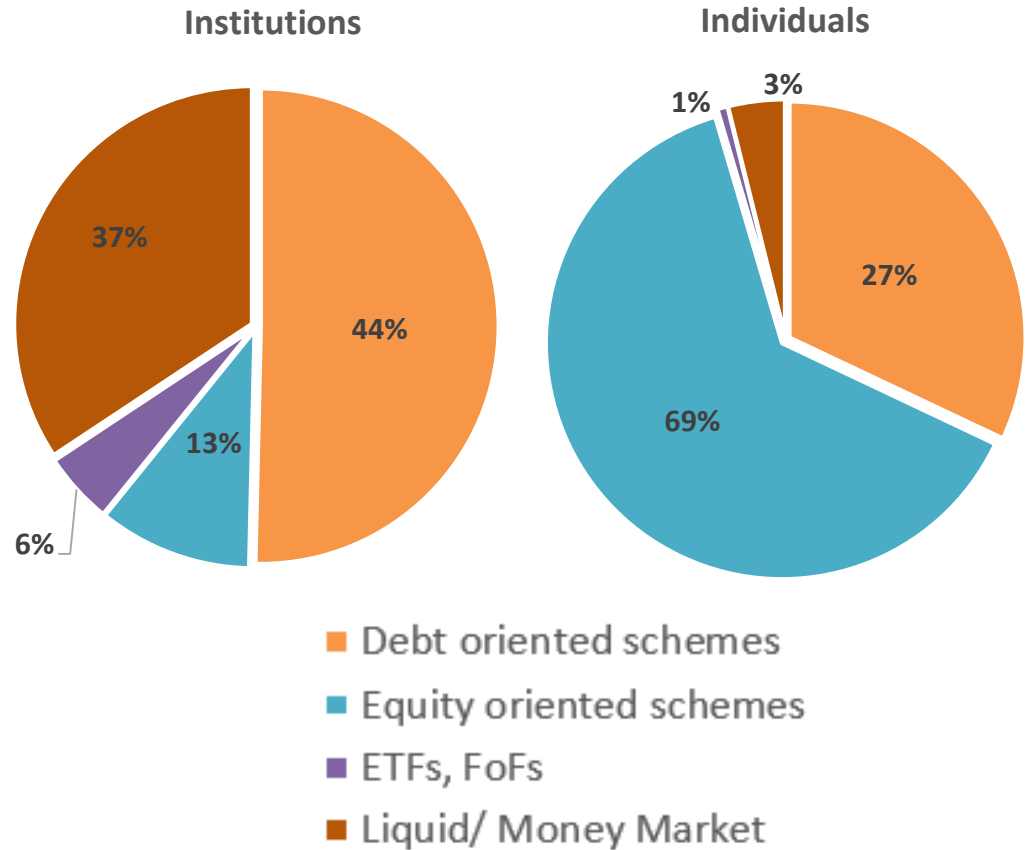

Composition of Investors' Holdings

Individual investors primarily hold equity-oriented schemes while institutions hold liquid and debt-oriented schemes.

69% of individual investor assets are held in equity oriented schemes.

81% of institutions assets are held in liquid / money market schemes and debt-oriented schemes.



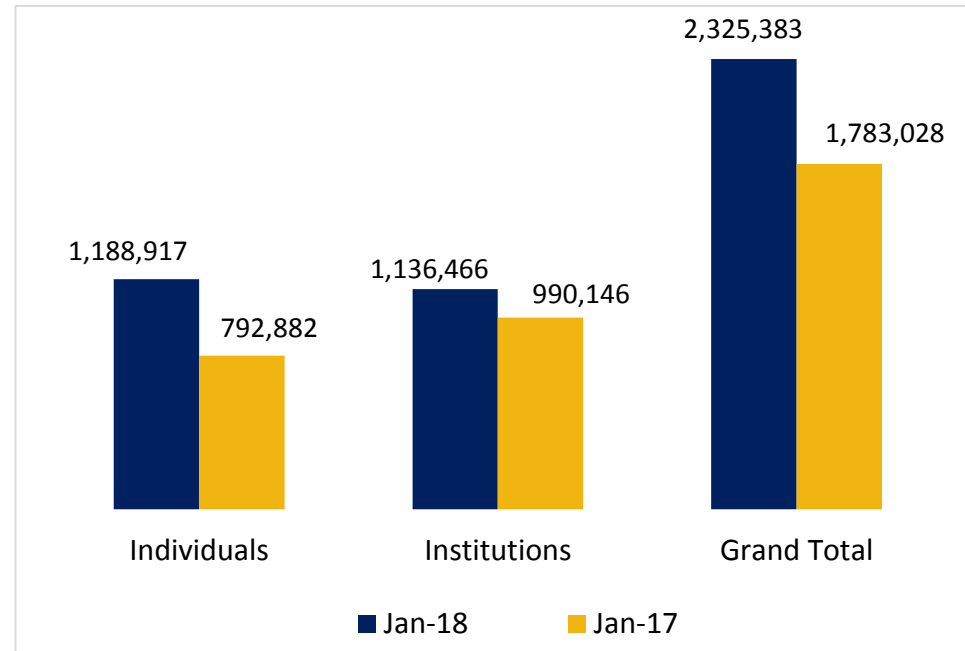

Growth in Assets



The value of assets held by individual investors in mutual funds increased from Rs.7.93 lakh cr in January 2017 to Rs.11.89 lakh cr in January 2018, an absolute increase of 49.95%.

The value of Institutional assets increased from Rs.9.90 lakh cr to Rs.11.36 lakh cr, an absolute growth of 14.78%.
